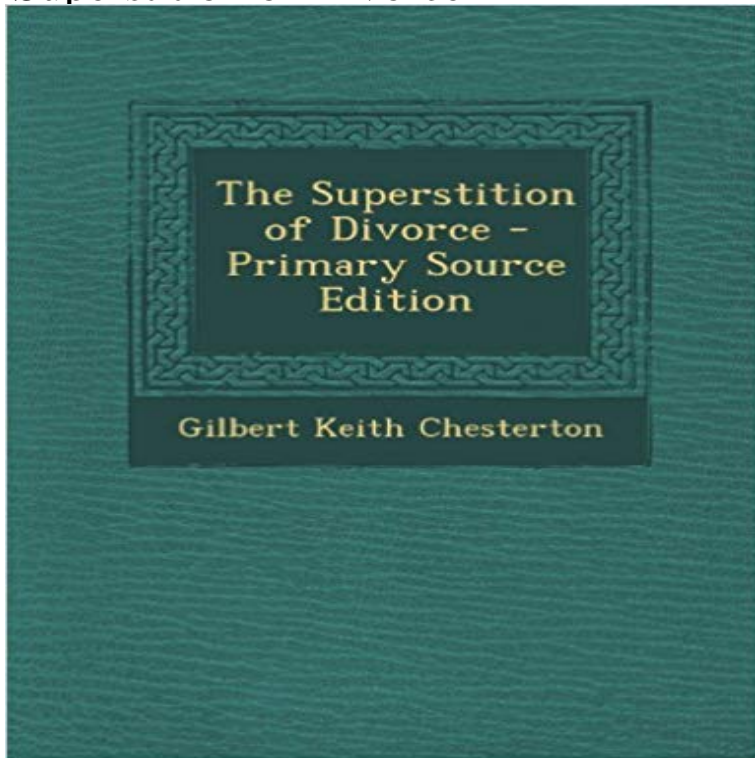


# Superstition of Divorce
