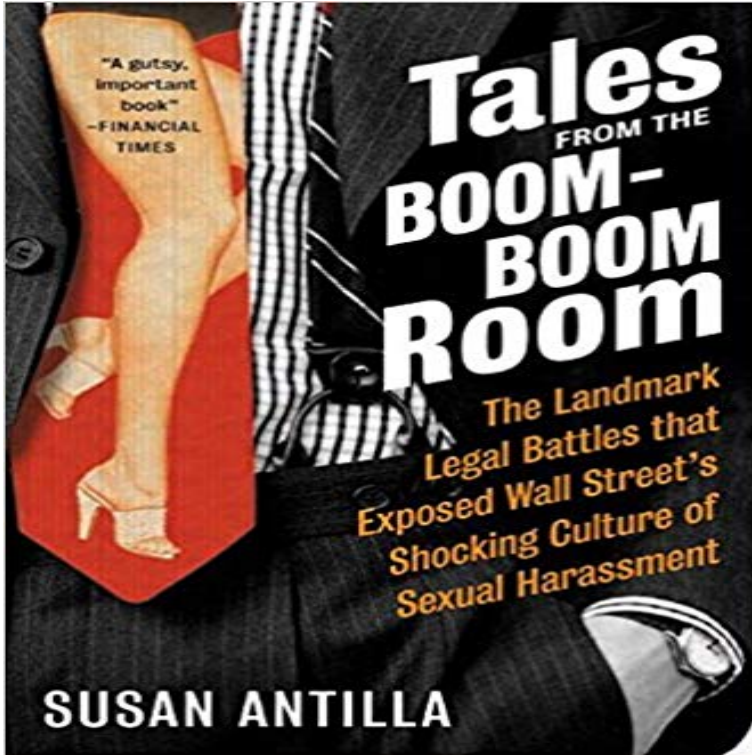


Tales from the Boom-Boom Room
